The International Cherokee Trails Rally marks the return of a pace noted FIA event to the United States! This is our opportunity to implement FIA guidelines and procedures and we need everyone's help to make this an enjoyable race for competitors and spectators. As a worker for this race, you get to be on the inside of the action.

If you are new to the sport of rallying, you may locate information about the sport at www.scca.org by selecting the Performance Rally section. If you are an experienced rally worker, you will find that this event offers new challenges as we step into implementation of FIA international rules and regulations regarding the operation of the race. There are jobs for everyone who would like to be a part of this event.

Level of Involvement: Because this race is a pace noted event where competitors get to run the roads in their street cars to make notes about them prior to competition, there are activities needing workers all week long.

All workers will need to attend the Worker Meeting and Training session on Wednesday, March 14th at the Radisson Read House in downtown Chattanooga, Tennessee. Worker registration will begin at 3pm until 6pm and our meeting will start at 6: 15pm and last until about 9:00pm. At this meeting you will receive your assignments and training.

We need help with Pre-race activities including Competitor Registration, Reconnaissance and the Press Stage on Sunday" through Wednesday. The responsibilities during these activities include hospitality or monitoring of activities and require little training. Those of you who can help on these days should be sure to get in touch with the Worker Coordinators, Steve and Cheryl Tompkins (706-891-3314), or Rally Manager, Kendall Russell (865-671-1133), prior to the event.

During the race competition, workers are needed to monitor competition stages, spectator areas, hospitality and information areas and service areas. Additionally we need Ham radio operators, EMT's and Physicians.

Chris Raglin, Jim Burruss, and myself headed to the Talledega Grand Prix Raceway for a March event which had timing problems and darkness awaiting the Mod/Prep group as 96 entrants made for a full Sunday for Alabama Region. Talledega is a fine facility for Solo II and I and if you get the chance in 2001 you gotta check any event held at at TGPR. A few of our members went to Alabama Region home autocross site and came back with reports of smooth pavement and good times. Mid-Summer had TAC/TVR

members head to a Tri-Lakes event at the MTSU campus in Murfreesboro, TN. with Mike Pessoney, Charles Wright, Jim Burruss, John Barnett, Chris Ragland, and myself taking on a handling course. Chris held off a couple of Corvettes and a Rail buggy to take FTD in this event, with several other 1st in class plaques taken up, Tri-Lakes has always been a great club to run with and their events are a little over 1 1/2 hours from Huntsville. The August Heat Series saw Mike Pessoney, Eddie Jory, Keith Ramey, Charles Wright, Chris Katechis, Jim Burruss, and myself take on the horsepower course at the Tennessee Region event in Shelbyville, Tennessee's Twin Fountain Raceway. This event site is very user friendly with a nice shaded picnic table area and even a grandstand seating area to watch the event if you are not working or driving. I liked the event so much I came back with Jimmy Webster in October to try it again. The course, at Twin Fountains, is fast with just enough tight corners to remind you that brakes are important for handling too. Steve Hoelscher made the ultimate out of town trip to the Solo II National Championships and won the DSP Championship again with his Fiat X1/9. A trip to the Nationals should be must for anyone devoted to Solo II a least once in a lifetime. The last event to try out was the Ho-Ho Solo put on by the Chattanooga Region on December 10th. The Chattanooga Region runs their events in Trenton, GA on a school parking lot, which is smooth and a little small, but they had a nice flow to the course in which we got 5 runs of 2 laps each.

2001 SEDIV Meeting

The Southeast Division (SEDIV) of the SCCA held its Annual Meeting on Jekyll Island, GA January 20 and 21. SEDIV is a legally constituted body responsible for the policies, programs, and procedures for all division wide SCCA activities: Divisional and National Rallies, Divisional Solo II events, Solo I events, South Atlantic Road Racing Championship (SARRC) events, Enduro Championship Racing (ECR) events, and National Racing events. The Regional Executives from the 18 SCCA Regions with-in SEDIV are the Board of Directors and make all decisions. There are two (2) SCCA Areas (3 and 12) with-in SEDIV and the SCCA BOD members from those two (2) areas serve as the President and Vice-President but have no voting power.

We arrived at the Jekyll Island Holiday Inn about 6:00 PM, chatted for a while with some fellow members. One of them was Phil Mellor, Area 12 BOD, representative. Ed Forest, Atlanta region also joined the conversation. After a few minutes Phil suggested that he find Steve and we all go have dinner (our wives were all in favor of that). Well there are a lot of people named Steve in SCCA and I had no idea

who he was referring too. But a few minutes later Phil returned and introduced Steve Johnson; no, not the WHNT news personality. Steve Johnson, President and CEO of SCCA!

After spending a few hours with Mr. Johnson I understand why the BOD hired him. My impression was that he is a personable, motivated, success driven individual and has many ideas about marketing SCCA. I am not so foolish as to think that every idea will pan out but after listening to him you can not help but believe that Steve Johnson will be a big help to SCCA!

Seminars

On Saturday I attended the rally, Solo 2 and Tech seminars. The big item of discussion during the Rally Seminar was the Cherokee Trails International Pro Rally in March. There is a large need for workers to help staff the event. Many of the assignments require SCCA membership, but some do not. As a result of interest in that rally there will be two (2) or three (3) Club Performance Rallies in SEDIV this year. (See separate story.) We also talked about the requirements for conducting a Road Rally (as opposed to a

Performance Rally). Road Rallies require no special safety equipment for the car or driver, but the rally course must be approved by a SCCA Road Rally Steward. There are several levels of Road Rallies. The lowest is a Social Rally, which must be under 90 miles in length and use minimal controls. The course must be approved by a Steward but a Steward can probably be trained over the phone.

The Solo 2 seminar centered around the SEDIV Solo 2 Series with a review of last years events and the proposed schedule for 2001. (See separate story.) One item of bad news was the lose of BFG sponsorship in 2001.

During the Tech seminar we reviewed the SEDIV classes which were scheduled to be dropped in 2001 (CS2000, CF2000, ITD, and ITGT. There are other classes available for these cars to run in.) However, about a dozen CS2000 drivers submitted a request to have the class continued for two (2) more years. After some discussion it was agreed to

recommend that to the REs at their meeting. Adding Spec Miata as a new regional only class was also discussed, and it was agreed to recommend it to the REs. There was also some discussion about safety requirements on Super production but no changes were considered. Also, since Legends car are now a homologated class in SCCA, they can no longer be classified as Super Production.

SEDIV Annual Meeting

The SEDIV Annual Meeting was held on Saturday afternoon. Stewards for each of the following activities made a presentation: Chief Steward, ECR, SARRC, Solo1, Solo2, Performance Rally, and Road Rally. There was nothing controversial in any of the reports. There was no old business and there was no new business. This was the quietest meeting anyone could remember.

REs Meeting

The REs Meeting was held on Sunday morning. The REs voted to increase the allocation to each steward and divisional administrators for Convention/Runoffs attendance from \$500 to \$1000.

There was a discussion about the need for Timing and Scoring software that would work with the AMB timing system to provide printed results in the format required by SCCA. Edge Software, which is currently being used with DB Com timing system will not interface with AMD. A committee was established to modify the Edge software to accept data from the AMD timing system. Additionally, the committee will look at adding a registration function to the Edge Software.

The ECR series will continue to use the DB Com timing system this year but needs more rental transponders. Additionally, the computers used by the ECR series have been requiring service. The REs voted to buy 20 used transponders and two (2) new computer systems for the ECR series. Total cost approximately \$3250.

Solo 2 steward reported that the Divisional Solo 2 Series was in very good health and would not need seed money from the SEDIV treasury in 2001. That was the first such occurrence in many years.

The Performance rally Steward reported on the program for 2001 and requested \$1500 support from SEDIV to help feed workers at the Cherokee Trails Rally. The REs voted to provide that support.

The Class Review Board presented it's recommendation to extend FC2000 for two (2) more years and to add Spec Miata as a new regional only class. The REs approved both measures.

The final item of business was a review of the 2001 SEDIV schedule. There were several additions and changes from the tentative schedule. The complete schedule is on the sedivracing.org web site. My big disappointment in the 2001 schedule is that there are no events currently scheduled at Nashville Superspeedway or Barber Motorsports Park.
